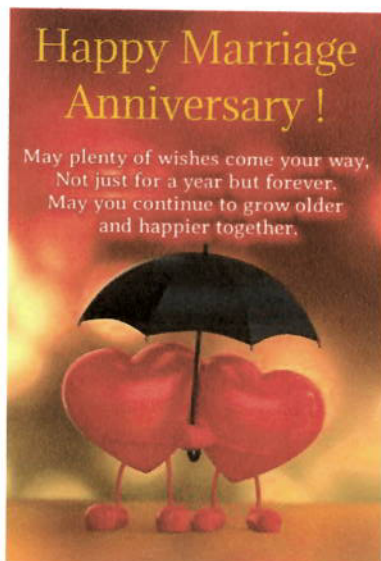

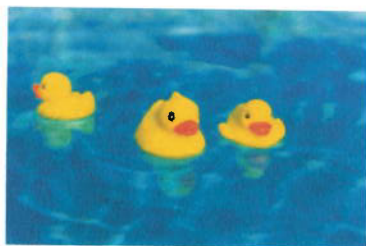
DAVID W. BEST
